Things to do E places to visit

1. Cottegloe Beach

A short bus ride from UniHall takes you to Cottesloe's breathtaking white sandy beach and stunning sunsets. If it's too crowded, go further down the coast (towards Fremantle) where you will find Leighton Beach, which is just as beautiful.





2. Kings Park & Botanic Garden

King's Park is one of the largest inner city parks in the world with more than 6 million people visiting it each year. Take a guided walk through the paths or explore WA's stunning nature yourself. You can casually stroll through the Federation walkway or the 'glass bridge', climb up the 101 steps of the DNA tower, admire the 750-year-old boab tree, or reflect at the State War Memorial Cenotaph precinct.

Our favourite is to overlook the Perth City skyline at night.

3. Swan Valley

A vast highway of wineries, chocolate factories and stunning rural sights. The House of Honey and Sandalford Winery are definitely our favourites!

4. Bold Park

Bold Park is a great place for a scenic walk amongst native plants and wildlife. Head to the lookout for stunning views of the Perth CBD and then take a walk through the Zamia Trail, a 5km loop taking around an hour and a half – perfect for a study break!



5. Serpentine Falls

Just an hour drive south of UniHall, this will make for a great day trip through Perth's more rural landscape. Whether you pack a picnic, relax by the waterfall or set out along one of the walk trails, you will be sure to have a wonderful day relaxing in nature here. Note that it's best to go in the wetter months so you can see the waterfall in all its glory.





7. Caversham Wildlife Park

A wildlife park brimming with animals and creatures.

Our favorite part is the huge roaming area for
kangaroos that you can pat and feed.

8. Araluen Botanics Park

A picture-perfect place for picnics and a day out in nature. For a true show-stopper we suggest you go in tulip season (every spring), as it's absolutely stunning.

6. Esmurdie Falls

The Falls are surrounded by a collection of picturesque walking trails that range from an easy walk to a more challenging hike. There can be quite a lot of climbing involved which may be a challenge for aspiring trekkers, but the views are definitely worth the sweat. Between June and November is the best time to visit as there is plenty of water at this time of year.




9. Raeburn Orchards

A fruit orchard worth a visit if you decide to go to Araluen. From dainty cherry blossoms in spring to fully-loaded persimmon trees in autumn, there is always something here worth seeing.

10. Hillarys Boat Harbour

This quaint marina is lined with a great range of eateries and stores — you're sure to find yourself over-indulging in delicious food or some retail therapy. No matter where you sit you will face a stunning seaside view and it's definitely one of the best spots to watch the sun set!


13. John Oldham Park

You don't need to venture far to find a hidden sanctuary in Perth!
Nestled on the outskirts of the CBD, John Oldham Park brings the beautiful flora and fauna of Western Australia to your doorstep.
Topped with a tropical waterfall, and an enormous slide that is enjoyed by young and old alike, this is the perfect place to sit in the sun, have a nice picnic and enjoy all that Perth offers. You may even be lucky enough to see some baby swans!

14. Bounce

Bounce is an indoor trampoline park with different sections for playing dodgeball, shooting basketball hoops, learning flips and wall running. Sessions run for an hour, or you can buy an entry for unlimited time. Bounce offers student discounts during certain times and requires booking ahead so you will need to be organised so you don't miss out!





17. Mettams Pool

Protected by a reef, this beach is nice and calm so it's good for less confident swimmers but even better for a snorkel.

Street Art Guide

Perth is full of street art surprises, particularly in the city and around Fremantle. While there will be plenty more to discover, here are a few of our favourite pieces.

ANYA BROCK

What: A vibrant stencil-style mural of Zebras. This is a favourite for taking keepsake pictures. Where: On the side wall of Ootong & Lincoln restaurant, Fremantle.

DREW STRAKER

What: Graffiti style neon cat and dogs by local artist Drew Straker. Where: Grand Lane, Central Perth.

ROA

What: Detailed painting of a Numbat. This realistic rendition of Western
Australia's animal emblem is by renowned Belgian street artist Roa. Where: The wall along Henderson Street Mall (near the side entrance of the Fremantle Markets).

ROBERT IENKINS

What: An unusual abstract painting of feathers and a goat. Where: The laneway alongside Ria Malay Kitchen, on Oxford Street, Leederville.

GRAFME RICHARDS

What: A colourful mural depicting market style shops and the beach. This is the biggest mural in Fremantle and is definitely one to see. Where: On the wall of East West Design, Fremantle.

VINCENT FANTAUZZO

What: An oil and acrylic tribute to Heath Ledger's turn as the Joker. This amazing mural was painted by Australian artist Vincent Fantauzzo, who is also a four-time Archibald Prize, People's Choice winner and was a close friend of Ledger. Where: In the foyer of The Backlot, Perth.

Grocery Guide

Aside from your usual Coles and Woolworths supermarkets (which can be found in the centre of both Claremont and Subiaco), here are a range of good grocery stores to check out when doing your weekly food shop.

GOLDEN CIRCLE SUBIACO

Right near the Subiaco train station, this grocer is always bustling and full of fresh fruit and veg. It's super cheap for all your fresh necessities and accompaniments such as seeds, nuts, flours and sauces.

IGA

Independent grocery stores that are open later than all other retailers making it handy to go shopping around your studies. The 24 hour IGA along Stirling Highway is perfect for late night study snacks – we can highly recommend their freshly baked muffins!

Whilst there are multiple other IGA's in the area, the closest is at Broadway Shopping Centre – only a small detour if you're already on campus and want to call past as you walk back to college.

SPUDSHED

These fresh food markets are open 24 hours, 7 days a week. With super cheap prices and local produce, it's worth traveling that little bit further to do your grocery shopping at Innaloo.


FARMER JACKS

46 Henry St, Fremantle

This beautiful café is in a secret garden-esque alleyway and part of an art gallery. Serving up typical café fare, it is the ambience that is special and perfect for an afternoon catch-up or de-stress!

5. Bread in Common

43 Pakenham St, Fremantle

One of our personal favourites! Enclosed in a lofty warehouse space, it may be expensive, but it is definitely worth it. You can enjoy an abundance of fresh wood-fired breads that will be the perfect accompaniment to anything you order.









6. Little Creatures Brewery

40 Mews Rd. Fremantle

Wind down after a long day in Freo with drinks and a good meal overlooking the water. The freshly brewed pale ale, pizza and mussels are all fantastic here.

7. Kailis Fish Market Café

46 Mews Rd. Fremantle

Must-stop shop for fish and chips in Freo! Though tourists may claim that Cicerello's has the best fish and chips, we think Kailis is just as good.

8. Bib& Tucker

18 Leighton Beach Blvd, North Fremantle Beautiful brunch place

Beautiful brunch place overlooking pristine Leighton Beach. If you're here for lunch their sliders and pizza are delicious!

9. The Modern Extery

Shop 6, 124 High Street, Fremantle
Shop 1, 595 Beaufort Street, Mount Lawley
The Japanese food here is pretty
on point with its fusion flavours.
We can definitely recommend
the oshi sushi and aburi sushi as
a must-try.







10. Natures Harvest

20 Napoleon St, Cottesloe
Your holistic health destination,
Nature's Harvest is a lot more
than just a café and health food
store. We love their smoothies
and customizable Super Bowls;
but if that's not enough, you
can even create your own hot
breakfast from scratch!

11. Mechanics Institute

222 William St, Northbridge
An industrial-style, laid-back
bar with split-level decks and
awesome atmosphere. Popular
for their cocktails, we love their
Bloody Mary served with a
Flipside burger!

12. The Merrywell

Crown Perth, Great Eastern Hwy, Burswood Situated outside Crown Casino, this restaurant does burgers and meat really well! We suggest you go for the sticky Jack Daniel's ribs or the Wagyu sliders.





13. Harvest Espresso

629 Albany Hwy, Victoria Park
A cozy brunch place located in
the hustle and bustle of Victoria
Park. Their menu changes
frequently to celebrate the best
that each season has to offer,
making it somewhere you could

never get bored of.

14. Addison & Steele

1/448 Fitzgerald St, North Perth
Arguably one of the best coffee
shops in Perth and home to some
of the City's best baristas! These
guys invented the espresso
tonic (espresso + tonic water)
which has been a recent trend
throughout Perth.

15. Koko Black

140 William St, Perth
Claremont Quarter, Claremont
It's pretty simple – chocolate,
all kinds of chocolate! If
you're anything like us and
love chocolate too, this will
become one of your go-to treat
stops. From chocolate drinks,
desserts and gourmet truffles,
Koko Black has your chocolate
cravings covered!

16. Took Backee I

Shop 6,542 Hay Street, Perth
A homely and affordable
authentic Korean restaurant
that oozes character. There's
nothing better than hot soup in
winter. Our personal fave is the
flavorsome beef bone soup with
beef strips and sweet potato
noodle.

17. Typika

331 Stirling Hwy, Claremont
This café and espresso bar is a
favourite brunch spot among
UniHallers—they even have their
own in-house artisan roaster for
their coffee beans. Though their
menu is constantly evolving with
new additions as the seasons
change, two of our favourite
constant fixtures are the Spiced
Beef Eggs Benedict and the
Buttermilk Pancakes!

18 Imperial Court

125 Melville Parade, Como
Head here for dim sum when
you're in the mood for some
Asian food. You will find
authentic steamed dumplings
in the soup, along with other
Cantonese delights!



19. Pleased to Meet You

38 Roe St, Northbridge

A popular date-night destination, this swanky bar/restaurant serves fusion food with an awesome ambience. Although it's a little pricey on a student budget, the suckling pig here is divine!

20. Millpoint Café Bookshop

254 Mill Point Rd. South Perth

A gourmet café with the choice to sit in the bookshop, that's nice and cosy in winter, or outside in the cool alfresco, which is perfect during the summer heat! This place serves superfilling breakfasts and lunches at reasonable prices – great for our student budgets!

21. Gill St Cafe and Deli

13 Gill St. Mosman Park

Nestled in the heart of Mosman Park suburbia, Gill St will soon become your favourite neighbourhood café! Perfect for a relaxed and delicious breakfast, brunch or morning tea. The pancakes feature honeycomb butter, making them absolutely divine!

22. Clangys Fish Pub

195 Challenger Parade, City Beach
An eclectic café and restaurant

performances creating an
amazing atmosphere and dining
experience like no other.

104 Marine Parade, Cottesloe
The stunning alfresco dining
and outdoor deck create a
magnificent atmosphere, making
it one of our absolute favourites!
You'll find many seasonal
specialties and offerings such as
the "Cott Coconut Stall" and an
outdoor cinema in summer, or
fire pits and S'more-making kits
in winter!

24. Flour Factory

16 Queen St, Perth

The iconic old flour mill has been renovated into a bar and restaurant that span across the three floors plus the rooftop terrace and lounge. With delicious food and a wonderful atmosphere, it is great for a fancy night out with friends!

25. The Standare

28 Roe St, Northbridge

This is where you'll find the best cocktails in Perth! With split levels and a huge courtyard, the venue and food are a great combination, but it's the cocktails that really make this place stand out.

26. Boude

349 Rokeby Rd, Subiaco

A cosy Mediterranean themed café - definitely the place to go for brunch. Our favourite is their breakfast bruschetta with cherry tomatoes, avocado and feta.

Their chai latté is also a must!



27. Pixel Coffee Brewers

226 Oxford Street, Leederville

From classics like French Toast, to new favourites including Acai and Nourish Bowls, this small cafe sure packs a punch with its range of delicious, fresh breakfast and lunch options. The perfect choice if you're wanting to treat yourself to something organic and a little more on the healthy side.

28. Unde Billys

Chinatown, 9/66 Roe St, Northbridge
Just inside Northbridge's Chinese
Gate, this is a great Chinese
restaurant that's open'til 4am!
Loved by many UniHallers, it's
perfect for late night, poststudy feasts!

29. Annalakshmi

Barrack Square, Riverside Dr, Perth
Annalakshmi, translated to
'mother of sustenance' is an
excellent restaurant also serving
as an Indian cultural and spiritual
immersion journey. The richness
of Indian vegetarian cuisines
together with the view of the
Swan River is an experience
indeed. The pay-as-you-want
structure of the restaurant is
another cherry on top!

30. Mama Tran

Corner Bovell Lane & St Quentin Avenue, Claremont

A chain of family-run Vietnamese restaurants, also described as a modern day hawker, making it as authentic as you can get. If you find yourself craving a bowl of pho, broken rice or simply something fresh and fragrant, give Mama Tran a try! Our favourites include Mi Kho, Pho Tai and the Banh Mi Thit.

31. Mr Munchies

4/669 Beaufort St, Mount Lawley
400 Albany Hwy, Victoria Park
A great sushi restaurant where
everything is made fresh so you
can personalise your order to
exactly what you like. We highly
recommend that you add their
wasabi aioli; definitely one of our
fave toppings!

32. The Cat Cafe

147 Rokeby Rd, Subiaco
With a combination of cats,
coffee and cakes the Cat Café
is the purrfect place to get your
feline fix! Spend half an hour to
an hour with the resident kitties
while enjoying some of the tasty
treats on offer. Note that quiet
hours are between 2-5pm, so
this is when the cats will be
least active.

33. The Moon

2/323 William St, Northbridge
The Moon is a late night retrostyled café with a cheerful atmosphere and enjoyable tunes. Perfect for a late night catch-up or treat, they serve delicious food until 1am. The soy chai is one of our favourite things to order—it's absolutely amazing here!

34. Whish Creamery

151 Rokeby Rd, Subiaco

If you're looking for something to satisfy that sweet tooth of yours then this is the place for you! Whether it's a cronut sandwich filled with fresh gelato or a gourmet milkshake, Whisk's got it all. It won't be long until you return to try something new!



35. Babooshka

7/189 William St, Northbridge

A cute little café in Northbridge, these guys were responsible for starting the fancy milkshake trend in Perth with their tripledonut-chocolate-coveredbacon shake. Anything from the Babooshka milkshake or brunch menu is a winner in our eyes!

36. Yelo

A great local business with numerous stores around Perth, Yelo is the ideal spot for a quick healthy lunch, snack or freshly squeezed juice!





37. The Raw Kitchen

181A High St, Fremantle

Despite being quite pricey, The Raw Kitchen is worth visiting at least once. The menu has a diverse range of raw, vegan and vegetarian food inside a warehouse-style building with awesome decor. Their Pad Thai is absolutely fantastic!

brilliant place for a night out if

FREMANTLE

PERTH CITY
