Pathways to Leadership

Pathways to Leadership provides residents with an opportunity to develop a range of employer valued skills and experiences. Residents are supported to follow their passions and interests and connect with others to develop new skills and expand their networks.

Participants in the Pathways to Leadership program are recognised under UWA's Advanced Co-Curricular Badging program. The badges can be easily displayed and shared across digital platforms to maximise visibility and recognition from potential employers to enhance their career opportunities.

Academic Advancement

The aim of this committee is to enhance academic performance and progress and to allow opportunities to network with peers and academic staff. The committee organises workshops, academic debates and the Mentor-Mentee program to better connect our community and support students during their studies.

Career Advancement

The Career Advancement committee creates networking opportunities and enhances the employability skills of residents. Workshops tailored to the latest recruitment trends, job-hunting tools and marketing to potential employers are organised by the committee. The range of topics include interview skills, effective LinkedIn profiles, how to network and promote yourself and how to write a successful CV and selection criteria.

Sites4Good

Participants learn the art of website construction. Sites4Good is an initiative that has been created to help small Australian charities with little or no digital presence, to promote their cause. Residents work hands on with charitable organisations from initial consultation through to handover of the final website, all whilst being mentored and guided by industry experts.

Diversity and Inclusion

This committee represents and promotes the diversity of individuals and groups that exist within the UniHall community. The committee strives to embed a culture in which everyone feels valued, involved, respected, and treated fairly and to bring forth new perspectives, connection, and heightened education in relation to social justice.

Environment Committee

The Environment Committee hosts a range of events, initiatives and projects designed to raise awareness about sustainability, environmental issues and solutions within the UniHall community and beyond. Projects range from innovative recycling ideas, sustainability projects and alternative energy sources, to the establishment and maintenance of communal vegetable gardens.



First Nations Students Committee

This committee works to raise awareness and knowledge about First Nations culture and history. This is done through information and educational sessions, hearing from guest speakers, tours and social events. The committee also supports residents from different nations to connect with Noongar land and history.



International Students Committee

This committee promotes the interests of international students through activities to raise cultural awareness and connection within the UniHall community. The committee works to strengthen cross-cultural connections, with an emphasis on traditions and customs.

Sport & Leisure Committee

The Sports & Leisure Committee works to raise awareness of health and well-being through sports and leisure activities. The committee promotes physical wellbeing and exercise to foster a sense of community and belonging. It also promotes the importance of having a balanced uni life, making time for study and physical activity.



Literary Society

The Literary Society promotes social and cultural awareness through the understanding and interest of literature. The society promotes interests related to books and written texts in an ever-changing digital world. The Literary Society holds regular meetings to discuss texts and will provide an opportunity for members to share their insights, ideas, and experiences.

HiRez Media

HiRez Media provides members an entry to the media production world through mini production projects at UniHall. Working on video and other digital media projects, members learn all aspects of the craft, from briefing and client liaison, to filming, production and editing.

The Arts

This committee promotes the arts in all their different facets to our residents. From painting, art & craft, therapy workshops and events through to attending live performances such as theatre plays, ballet concerts and opera.

Student Music Committee

The Student Music Committee (SMC) brings the UniHall community together through live musical events. SMC creates music and soundtracks for broader special events and activities.

The committee also runs regular events such as Radio Talk (where they take over the playlist in Dining Hall once a week) and the Life in the Quads podcast. This helps keep our community lively, entertained and positively engaged.





More Opportunities

Academic Celebrations

Student achievement is a huge component of the UniHall community. Here, UniHall and UWA academics come together to honour our highest achieving residents.

Residential Advisors

UniHall has a large team of students leaders, known as Residential Advisors (RAs). RAs develop quality leadership experience in their roles supporting fellow residents with many aspects of student life at UniHall.

McCusker Centre for Citizenship

Our partnership with the McCusker Centre for Citizenship means our residents can take part in real internships to develop hands-on experience in their fields of interest or study.

UniHall Ambassadors

Ambassadors are one of UniHall's greatest assets. Current residents have the opportunity to represent the college to the wider community.





Location, location!

UniHall is only a 2-minute walk from campus. Plus, we're also close to cafes, restaurants and popular shopping areas.

Getting around is easy with a bus stop right out the front. If residents want to venture a little further they can use a share car from the on-site Student Car Share Program.

24/7 Support Network

Our residents feel comfortable in the UniHall community with a network of staff and senior residents on site to provide help, support and advice.

A team of four staff members live on site for support and pastoral care for all residents. Additionally, our large team of residential advisors work with staff to provide peer support for residents.

Around-the-clock support is provided to our residents, first by having Duty RA's on shift from 6pm until midnight each day.

Our unique connection with UWA means our residents also benefit from UWA's security features. UniHall receives regular patrol by UWA Security, who are also on call once our Duty RAs finish their shift. Residents can also request a UWA Security team member to walk them home from campus if they are studying late.

Sport & Fitness

UniHall offers a range of sporting events, physical pursuits, and social recreation opportunities for residents. All residents also get a UWA gym membership included as part of their rental package.

UniHall has a weekly sports program which includes social and competitive sport through Inter-College and UWA Sports events. Residents can choose from a wide range of sports including soccer, badminton, volleyball, touch rugby, hockey, basketball, tennis, dodgeball, AFL, ultimate and more.

We proudly encourage participation among residents of all skills levels and believe that sport helps build strong friendships and memories while everyone is having a go.

All residents have access to the UWA Sports Fitness Centre. UWA Sport's state-of-the-art weights room and group fitness classes including yoga, pilates, body pump and Zumba are just a few minutes walk from UniHall. Residents also have access to the UWA Aquatic Centre located near the Human Movement building on the main UWA campus.





Our Facilities

UniHall is well equipped with outstanding facilities to support residents' studies, independent living, wellbeing and recreation.

Residents can access a range of study facilities at UniHall to make studying easier. Our common study rooms and computer rooms can support independent and group study, are fully connected to the UWA computer systems and are available 24/7 to all residents at UniHall. Our library has a range of text books and recreational reading material, all donated by past and present UniHallers.

When residents need a break from studying, they're able to unwind in our games room, music rooms, art room and common areas.

Our games room is decked out with pool tables, games, TV and Foxtel, gaming consoles and more. Our music rooms have instruments for residents to play, and provide a great environment for residents to practice, on their own or with friends. Plus our outdoor courtyards and basketball courts provide great opportunities for residents to get outside and be active.

We also support residents with independent living with our mail collection facilities, laundry rooms and dining hall.

We have room packages to suit the needs of students in different stages of their university life.

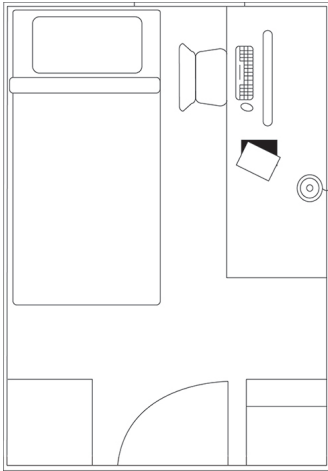
